They're flying high at Lakeview Estate

MOAMA'S Lakeview Estate is now home to two magnificent heron sculptures.

The sculptures, by acclaimed artist Folko Kooper, are crafted from corten and stainless steel and have an impressive wingspan exceeding six metres.

The herons will rise out of the waters of the new lake, currently being constructed at the heart of the estate.

Villawood's regional Victoria general manager Julian Perez said he was thrilled to finally see the herons erected.

"We are very excited the herons have been installed as they have been on quite a journey already just getting to Moama," he said.

"The installation is the culmination of months of work in design and creation of the sculptures by Folko Kooper in Tasmania, shipping to the mainland and then transport to Moama."

The stunning surrounds will be further enhanced with a new playground and barbecue facilities.

"We want this to be a central hub to bring the Lakeview residents together and create a vibrant, healthy, safe and connected community," Mr Perez said.

The new public space is set for completion early in the 2019 new year.

Villawood Properties will also be running a ''name the heron'' competition through Moama Primary School and Moama Anglican Grammar School

Local students can name each of the herons to go in the running for a \$500 voucher from Intersport Bennett's.
