The whole Villawood team works incredibly hard to deliver the best outcome for the people living in our communities. Seeing communities flourish is the fulfilment of Villawood's vision that community serves as the third pillar of sustainability; in addition to Energy and Water savings.

For this reason, we're incredibly proud to receive this year's UDIA Community Engagement Excellence Award, which was given to our Armstrong Mt Duneed community in recognition of leadership and innovation in services and social infrastructure provision. A Developer with a Difference: *Caring for the Carers*


Fostering an authentic sense of community is the beating heart of what Villawood Properties stands for. In this spirit, we are always seeking ways to make genuine connections with the people living in our communities, as well as the community at large. It's all connected in our eyes.

In 2018, Villawood launched its Care Worker Support Program, which acknowledges the crucial role care workers play in caring for our communities and seeks to make the dream of home ownership more accessible to them. This is achieved through the reservation of 10% of lots released across our communities and a \$10,000 rebate given to eligible Care Workers.

Since its launch, the Care Worker Support Program has been taken up by nurses, firefighters, teachers, police, paramedics, and personal and aged care workers. It has also earned the endorsement of Premier Daniel Andrews.

Kamarooka Land Transfer

For every block of land sold in a Villawood Properties community, we've donated the equivalent area to the Greater Bendigo National Park. This initiative has been going since 2008, when we first acquired some land in Kamarooka Forest.

The equivalent area of all the lots sold since then has accumulated to approximately 520ha – the equivalent of 270 times the size of the MCG!

On 12 October 2018, we presented Jacinta Allan MP, in her capacity at the local member for East Bendigo, with the title to 255ha of Kamarooka Forest, so that it may be enjoyed by future generations of Victorians. The transferred land will now be jointly managed by Dja Dja Wurrung and Parks Victoria, with Villawood Properties continuing to fund this arrangement for the next decade.

A Great Foundation for the Future of Living!

In October 2018, we celebrated the start of construction of the first house at Aquarevo in Lyndhurst. Aquarevo is a unique collaboration between Villawood Properties and Victorian Government utility South East Water. Aquarevo is also Australia's most water and energy efficient residential development: each home in the community will reduce reliance on drinking water by up to 70 per cent and cut energy consumption by up to 60 per cent.

The first home will showcase the water and energy saving initiatives that will feature in all 460 homes of the community.

The first house is being constructed by Arden, who have added their own flair to the Aquarevo design guidelines – including carpet made from recycled Coca Cola bottles – to deliver an elegant eight-star home.

We're looking forward to seeing the Aquarevo model in practice and to exploring opportunities to further advance sustainable residential communities in growth areas.

Social Sustainability

We work to the philosophy that connection to place is built over time, through many positive experiences. Here are some fantastic examples of this occurring across the various community life stages.

Early days: A 'focus group' was recently held with our youngest residents at Rathdowne Wollert. They shared their own designs of their perfect playground so we can better understand what elements of the community park would be most valued. The classic swings and slides still rate highly! While the kids were on the crayons, parents volunteered their thoughts on the features they would use the most at the future Club Rathdowne. These insights will be shared at a Club preview session with the broader Rathdowne community in early 2019, to ensure a true sense of ownership is felt by all residents.

Activating open space: In October, we launched a free boot camp for residents in our Waratah Mickleham community, to promote health and happiness while bringing people together in the new Village Green. The boot camp is part of a twelve-month program of activity that's been devised to activate this special space.

Club connection: Our signature Residents' Clubs provide families with a safe and inclusive space, and a springboard for social connection. This year, we launched our sixth Residents' Club, Club Delaray, in Clyde North. Since its opening, families have been flocking to the pools, tennis court, gym, parents lounge and other features, as well as Deoro & Co – the café that sits within the Club and run by Delaray Residents Steve and Elisha. We're looking forward to fostering even more local love, with construction of the Leisure Centre at the Surrounds, Helensvale (QLD) underway.


Best in Show

We were happy to oblige and commissioned Folko to create a 200KG sculpture of a majestic eagle, to keep a watchful eye over the park.

Villawood's ongoing investment in public art is reflective of our commitment to design and creativity as a responsible developer. Folko's corten steel sculptures deliver our residents an enormous sense of pride in terms of the sense of place and we're excited to be able to share this with the wider community.

Here's a short preview, the story of one of our longest serving, repeat residents, the Sudweeks family from Bendigo.



The Sudweeks Family

The family home is generally the single biggest purchase most people make in their life, it's not that often customers come back – let alone multiple times.

This makes four-time Villawood buyers Tony and Carmel Sudweeks, of Bendigo, quite the rarity.

Over a journey dating back to 1990, it's also made them good friends with Villawood as well.

"I still catch up with Rory and Julian every so often," Tony says, chuckling lightly.

"It all goes back to Rory taking over an estate in Maiden Gully where some bloke had gone broke. We had a deposit on the block and Rory assured me everything would be okay.

"Since then, I've got to know Julian Perez, too – he played footy with my son and his wife is best friends with one of my daughters.

From Maiden Gully, to Penzance to Junoturn and ultimately Imagine the reason the Sudweeks stayed was simple: Villawood did things right.

"They didn't just whack roads and gutters in. They put the parks and playgrounds in for people as they went – not years later like other developers."

"Julian took us out to the new Imagine estate. He opened the gates, shooed the cows away, went over a couple of creeks, drove us all around.

"He pointed out where the roads would be, there were enough pegs in the ground for me to follow. He gave me a complete drawing of the estate and everything they'd do – the parklands, the wetlands – and he said, 'You can have first pick'."

Queensland 1,000 lots with 1,000 opportunities



Opportunities for South East Queensland builders are continuing to gain momentum with construction now underway on all three of Villawood's active communities in the sunshine state.

Villawood is delivering 1,000 new homesites in the region, with more than 224 hectares of land for new builds. The Surrounds in Helensvale, on the Gold Coast is on track to deliver 620 homesites by 2021. Approximately 60 of the total 158 homes have been completed at Montego Hills at Kingsholme, while construction is now underway on the first homes at Sequana at Logan Reserve.
